Jesus Rebukes ...

Simon's mother-in-law was suffering from a high fever. They asked him to help her. He stood over her, rebuked the fever, and it left her. Luke 4:38-39

Simon Peter's mother-in-law was sick, terribly ill. She was confined to her bed. This was not just a simple sniffle or cough. This was a cannot get out of bed I have such a fever that I can barely move and I might not even be fully aware of what is going on illness.

Jesus teaches us a couple of truths with the illness to Peter's mother-in-law. The first is the way he treats the illness. Notice the word that Luke uses to heal Peter's mother-in-law. **He stood over her, rebuked the fever...** He did not simply heal the illness. He rebuked it. Just like he rebuked the demons earlier on in the day. It's important for us to know this important truth, namely, that any kind of pain that we suffer, Satan will use to drive a wedge between us and God.

Everyone suffers in this life. We all have illness and sickness. Our bodies are all subject to decay. We have trials and disappointments. However, for the Christian, we have Satan working to use these pains to drive us away from God. The unbeliever and the believer can both have difficult illnesses that can cause them to end up in the hospital. They can both be put on a ventilator. Satan will use that struggle to lead the Christian away from God. He can also use it drive a wedge between us and others around us. Both believers and unbelievers can struggle with depression and anxiety. However, Satan is going to use anything to make the believer to doubt that God cares about him or is with him.

When things don't go our way, when our recovery is longer than we expect, when it meets setbacks and failures, when life does not seem to match the joyful expectations that we had, we can turn our anger at each other. We can turn our anger on God. We can turn our anger inward on ourselves. We can also let fear and worry run rampant in our lives. We can find other sinful solutions to distract us from our anger, worry, or fear. Don't be unaware of the devil's schemes; he wants to find anyway to rip apart your relationship with God and with one another.

That's why it is important to see the other truth here. Jesus did not just snap his fingers and Peter's mother-in-law. He bent over where she was. He got down on her level. In that moment, the only person that appeared to truly matter to Jesus was Peter's mother-in-law. Too often today, we may feel like we are just another number or just another person in the hospital. We seem like just

another birth date or case study. Not to Jesus. Though he fills the whole universe, though he knows everything. He comes in a sits down with you, as you hear his Word. As you pray to him, you are the only person on his agenda, as he hears your thanksgiving, praise, and requests. You are not just another number, another person, another faceless person. You are his dearly loved child. He has all the time in the world for you to remind you of the love he has personally given you. He has all the time in the world to show you how he has taken on all your illness and discomforts. He has all the time on his agenda to show how he has taken your place for all the anger, fear and worry. He is your personal Savior from sin, Satan, and illness itself. It does not matter, if you are in a meeting, going out to fix the machines, sipping coffee with your friends or you are by yourself, or if you sitting in the doctor's office, he is with you to strengthen you and remind you of how he has sent your personal demons away.

As he rebuked the demons and the illnesses, he sends your personal demons and the devil packing back to where they came from with his almighty power. When it comes to your own life, God wants you to see the demons that are driving a wedge between you and God and between you and each other. Before you lash out in anger, before you throw up your hands in despair, before you lose sleep with worry and anxiety, focus on how the devil is using these challenges in your life to ruin your relationship with God and your brothers and sisters in Christ. Rebuke them. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Stand in the power that God had to silence the demons. Stand firm in the fight. With the help of Christ, you will stand firm in victory.

Table of Duties: The Forgotten Stewardship Tool

Luther's Small Catechism is a magnificent tool. Joined with a well-used copy of the Holy Scriptures and an orthodox hymnal, and the Christian is well equipped to live a life of faithfulness to the Lord and service to the neighbor. First in German and now in English and just about any language known to man, this handy masterpiece has introduced generations of people to the central doctrine of justification by grace, through faith, on account of Jesus Christ. The Six Chief Parts have proven to be a faithful framework for a clear confession of the truth of the Gospel for nearly five hundred years!

But more than a textbook, the Small Catechism also serves well as a handbook for Christian living. As a part of its treasure, there is an element that teaches an extraordinarily strong message of stewardship. That hidden treasure that needs to be rediscovered is called the Table of Duties.

The Table of Duties is really nothing more than a categorized gathering of Bible verses. These verses are set apart for "various holy orders and positions, admonishing them about their duties and responsibilities." Addressing pastors and people, government and citizens, husbands, wives, children, youth, workers and so many more, it very clearly lays out what faithful stewardship looks like. Even better, these assembled passages teach one important truth: we are stewards of one another!

The Table is much more than a "how-to" tool; it also lays out the interconnectedness that exists within the body of Christ. Pastors are described by what they are to be as stewards of the Word. 1 Timothy 3 highlights the characteristics of a faithful pastor. Even more, Titus 1 highlights the need for the pastor to be faithful for the sake of those under his care.

Those who hear the faithful preaching of the pastor are stewards of the pastor as well. 1 Corinthians 9 talks about the need for the people to support the livelihood of the pastor. Galatians 6 talks about how the hearers share in the good things that the pastor teaches. 1 Timothy 6 talks about the honor that is owed to the pastor, not because of WHO he is, but rather WHAT he is teaching! Hebrews 13 shows the impact of this stewardship on the pastor, that they perform their duties with joy. Joyful pastors and people are always going to be better stewards of the Gospel!

Outside the church this interdependent stewardship is on display as well. Romans 13 highlights the respect necessary for the governing authorities. As citizens, the faithful steward is called to pay taxes (Matthew 22), pray for their leaders (1 Timothy 2) and that they should be ready to serve in the civil realm (Titus 3), because they are in these positions by God's direction (1 Peter 2).

These steward duties are in the home too! 1 Peter 3 and Colossians 3 shape the husband steward. Ephesians 5 and 1 Peter 3 shape the wife steward. Ephesians 6 form parental stewards and child stewards.

The Table of Duties is a wonderful place for the individual steward to learn how much our stewardship is more than just a "me and Jesus thing!" In fact, it ends with these words: "Let each his lesson learn with care, and all the household well share fare." This is interdependent stewardship on clear display. As each learns stewardship in this way, the more faithful we will be as a family, congregations, communities and the church at large.

The Calvary Columbarium

Calvary Lutheran Church of Chandler, Arizona, has a columbarium on its property for the use of its members and their families. The columbarium offers an economically feasible way to handle the final resting place needs of its members.

The columbarium contains small compartments or “niches” to hold the cremated remains of loved ones. Our columbarium has single niches (which can contain one cinerary urn) and double niches (which can contain two cinerary urns.) Single niches cost \$1,250 and double niches cost \$1,500.

Included in the cost are a brass urn and a granite face plate engraved with the name of the deceased. Payment plans are available. There are funeral arrangement packets in the literature racks above the back counter in the church entryway that contain columbarium order forms. For more information, talk with Pastor Spaude.

The Holy Week Prophecies of Zechariah

Catechetical Review of The Creed

For over 1000 years, Ash Wednesday has been observed as the solemn beginning of the penitential season Lent. It began as a stand-alone Wednesday service, much like Ascension is a stand-alone Thursday service. Additional mid-week Lenten services were a much later addition, generally used for catechetical review.

In Lutheranism, the Catechism has long been associated with Lent. Martin Luther himself used the season to review the parts of the catechism. In a Lenten sermon of 1529, he wrote, "*This exhortation ought not only to move us older ones, but also the young and the children. Therefore, you parents ought to instruct and educate them in the doctrine of the Lord: the Decalog, the Creed, the Prayer, and the Sacraments*" (W.30,1,233). Luther would preach on parts of the catechism and ask parents to review those portions with their children throughout the week.
