Revelation 15 Seven Angels, Seven Plagues

1. The last vision in the Vision of the Seven Visions opens the door to the Vision of the Seven Bowls. Draw a detailed picture of what John saw in Rev. 15.

Revelation 16:1-11 The First Five Bowls

2. Compare Trumpets 1-5 from the Vision of the Seven Trumpets (Rev. 8:7-9:11) with Bowls 1-5 from the Vision of the Seven Bowls (Rev. 16:1-11). How are they similar? How are they different?

Trumpet 1 vs Bowl 1 (Rev. 8:7 vs Rev. 16:2)

Trumpet 2 vs Bowl 2 (Rev. 8:8, 9 vs Rev. 16:3)

Trumpet 3 vs Bowl 3 (Rev. 8:10, 11 vs Rev. 16:4-7)

Trumpet 4 vs Bowl 4 (Rev. 8:12 vs Rev. 16:8, 9)

Trumpet 5 vs Bowl 5 (Rev. 9:1-11 vs Rev. 16:10, 11)

3. What events do the first five bowls portray?

Revelation 16:12-21 *The 6th & 7th Bowls & the Battle of Armageddon*

4. Draw a detailed picture of what the sixth bowl unleashes. (Rev. 16:12-16)
